Whichever direction you come from, the road to Linköping is bothered by a changing variety of farmland, forests and lakes. Linköping has enjoyed a rapid growth since the founding of the University and the University Hospital. The town has developed to become Sweden's fifth largest, with a population of about 140 000. Linköping is situated about 200 kilometres southwest from Stockholm. The University Hospital of Linköping provides high-specialised medical services to the southeast region a population of approximately 1 million and the hospital has around 700 beds. Problem based teaching and multiprofessional education are well established within this academic institution. Nurse education programmes are offered at undergraduate and postgraduate levels. The department of Urology is responsible for urological care in Östergötland County with 400.000 inhabitants. This specialist urology unit in Linköping consists of one ward (22 beds), an intermediate care unit (4 beds), an outpatient clinic, a stone treatment centre and operating theatres. We also have one



ward with 12 beds at Vrinnevisjukhuset in Norrköping. Outpatients are seen in further two hospitals (Norrköping and Motala).

The team in Linköping consists of a professor of urology, one head urologist and 10 urologists (each with specialised interests) a group of experienced nurses and auxiliaries.

The ward: The nursing team on the ward are headed-up by a senior nurse of urology with two ward managers, 15 RN and 10 auxiliaries. There are three established teams on the ward with responsibility for different patients groups, for example stone patients, oncology and general urology.

In the outpatient clinic there is a clinic manager, 4 RN and 1 auxiliary. The nurses here have specialised interests including continence promotion and management, prostate cancer follow up, catheter management clinics and BPH follow up. Important roles of these nurses are also the provision of face to face and telephone information and support to all urology patients. The nurses are also involved in diagnostic procedures with the medical staff for example prostatic ultrasound and biopsy and cystoscopy.

The unit is committed to providing high quality multi-disiplinary care with the medical and nursery team driving forward innovative and expert practice innovations.
