1.	Welcome by the chair - the report of the chair with the presentation of the achievements of 2024/2025, Corinne Tillier	
	 The Chair opened the meeting and welcomed all the delegates. She reported as follows: In the past year the focus was on education for nurses and OR assistants and on seeking financial support. Successful events included the ERUS meeting (the robotic nurses' meeting) in Bordeaux (organised by the SIG Endourology & Robotics), and two ESUN courses (organised thanks to the SIG Bladder cancer and Prostate cancer) in 	
	 Lisbon, Portugal. Webinars and podcasts continued, and social media was used to promote this with contributions from Marta Marchetti, Tiago Santos, Marcin Popinski, Federico lo Giudice, and Tania Marin. 	
	 International collaborations with ESNO, INUS, and ECO were maintained. Together with BAUN and ANZUNS/NZUNS the development of an educational framework for urology nursing was continued. It will be completed and go into the next phase, implementation, soon. 	
	 EAUN is a member of the EPAG, a European Patient Advocacy Group and this means we have two meetings a year and we participate in their programme at the annual congress. Friday the 21st we organised a programme about Patient Advocacy here in Madrid. 	
	The guidelines are also a main focus for the chair in the coming year.

4.	Report by the Board Members 2024/25	
	Accreditation & endorsement, presented by Corinne Tillier	
	Accreditation provides organisers of training and educational activity with the	
	opportunity to demonstrate their commitment to EUAB-CNE's standards.	
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	(EUAB-CNE). Applications are made via the eu-acme.org website.	
	 The International EAUN meeting in Madrid is accredited with 16 points. 	
	EAUN endorsement provides organisations (including non-profit), with the opportunity	
	to demonstrate their commitment to high standards of urological patient care.	
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	EALIN andersed 2 educational programmes in the last year including TRANSITION and a	
	EAUN endorsed 2 educational programmes in the last year, including <u>TRANSITION</u> and a	
	video programme for <u>advanced renal cell carcinoma</u> by COR2ED.	
	Guidelines by Corinne Tillier	
	Co-leads: Corinne Tillier (NL), Lisbeth Leinum (DK)	
	In 2024, the update of both guidelines in the catheterisation domain, focusing on	
	indwelling catheters in adults (both urethral and suprapubic) and urethral intermittent	
	catheterisation, have been finalised under the leadership of Susanne Vahr (DK) and	
	Veronika Geng (DE). They are available on the EAUN website.	
	In 2025, with support and a grant of Wellspect, a summary of the guideline on	
	Intermittent catheterisation has been produced. It was presented at their symposium	
	organised at EAUN25 (with a QR code for download) and will be available on the EAUN	
	website.	
	Under the leadership of Bente Thoft (DK) and Kathryn Chatterton (GB), an EAUN	
	Guideline Panel, in collaboration with the EAU Guidelines Office, is actively engaged in	
	updating the intravesical instillation guideline, a critical aspect of urological nursing	
	care. The anticipated publication of this updated guideline is expected soon in 2025.	
	Scientific Congress Office by Mattia Boarin and Lisbeth Roesen Leinum	
	Mr. Mattia Boarin, the Chair of the Scientific Congress Office, thanked his Co-chair	
	Lisbeth Leinum, from Denmark, and all the participants for this successful conference:	
	we had 3 Plenary Sessions, 10 State-of-the-art Lectures, 14 Thematic Sessions, and	
	more than 330 participants from 40 different countries.	
	He also thanked all SCO members, Morna Jones (GB), Pia Albin (CH), Claire Cassels (GB)	
	for their excellent work and especially Lynn Casey, from Ireland, who has completed	
	her 3-year term and is now stepping down as SCO member. She made a great	
	contribution, this and previous years, and was acknowledged with a certificate for her	
	important work.	
	Lastly, a warm welcome to the incoming member of the SCO: Elisabeth Grov Beisland	
	from Norway.	
	Lisbeth Leinum then took this opportunity to share some information about the work	
	in the SCO: SCO members serve a three-year term, which results in regular turnover	

within the organisation. She encouraged the members to consider joining the SCO. The next call for new members will be issued end 2025/beginning 2026, giving you ample time to think it over. Social Media by Tiago Santos Co-lead: Marcin Popinski (PL) Tiago highlighted the importance of social media in amplifying EAUN's reach and engagement: Over the past year, we've focused on enhancing our presence and engaging our members, resulting in increased visibility for EAUN activities, especially through our LinkedIn and Instagram accounts. Posts about EAUN educational activities received the highest engagement. Our goal is to foster a closer relationship with the members. We're promoting membership benefits, such as Tania Marin's recent sharing of her fellowship experiences. As a 2-year member, you can apply for this exchange programme, with EAUN covering all expenses. We're also sharing EAUN podcasts on platforms like Spotify, Apple Music, and YouTube, accessible via the EAU mobile app. Stay tuned for updates on future EAUN activities and educational opportunities. Chair: Stefano Terzoni (IT) • SIG Prostate Cancer. Chair: Natasha Roberts (AU) SIG Endourology & Robotics. Chair: Anna Mohammed (UK) SIG Sexual Health. Chair: Jeannette Verkerk-Geelhoed (NL) The SIGs have done an amazing job in the past year. They have played a pivotal role in developing Webinars, Podcasts, ESUN courses, the ERUS Meeting, Thematic sessions and other sessions at the EAUN congress, representing EAUN as speaker at international conferences, developing EAUN Guidelines, and contributing to the newsletters. The fruits of all this work can be found at the EAUN websites, as e-courses, news articles, YouTube videos, conference resources, and on the podcast channels of the EAU(N). EAUN members with expertise in one of these urological fields (urology nurse, clinical nurse, nurse practitioner, physician assistant, urotherapist, physiotherapist or other health care professionals) can join the SIGs. E-courses and Fellowships by Marcin Popinski E-courses are available through the link provided on the slide, for example Nephrostomy catheters, which is a very interesting e-course. Now, let's talk about the fellowship, which is a Nurses' Exchange Programme. Participating in this fellowship allows you to visit hospitals in different cities or countries. This year, Tania Marin took part in the fellowship. We used Snapshot to share updates on social media, which you can find on our Facebook page. A detailed day-by-day report of the fellowship is also available there. Membership development and Finances by Paula Allchorne We have 13 national group memberships, which stayed stable, while the total

	membership number went up slightly to 2,950. Membership fee income was 13,440	
	euros.	
	Unfortunately, our finances are not as strong as we would like. We would not be here	
	if it weren't for the EAU. They provide us with 25,000 euros every year, and we also	
	receive admin support from Hanneke. As was shown in the financial report of 2024, we	
	incurred a significant loss of 56,000 euros. Our main losses have primarily come from	
	the Paris congress, ERUS, and the ESUN courses. We are facing substantial financial	
	needs, and unfortunately, sponsorship has not been enough to cover our expenses.	
	We will again approach pharmaceutical and tech companies this year to explore	
	potential ways to increase our income. Overall, we are fortunate that the EAU enables	
	us to organise all activities for urology nurses despite our lack of funds. Thank you.

	an incredible opportunity. He's been inspired by many people during just two	
	conferences, and he admires the board's mission to enhance patient care and support	
	nursing skills development.

	Rikke Knudsen's introduction: Rikke works in the Department of Urology at Aarhus	
	University Hospital. She has been in the field of urology since I became a nurse in 2004.	
	Since 2014, she have served as the chair of the Danish National Nurses Society in	
	Denmark. She is honoured to have the opportunity to join the EAUN board. She looks	
	forward to the approval of her candidacy by the members and the chance to contribute	
	to the development of urology nursing in the future. She is also eager to work with all	
	her colleagues here.

Goodbye to Paula Allchorne as Past Chair by Corinne Tillier

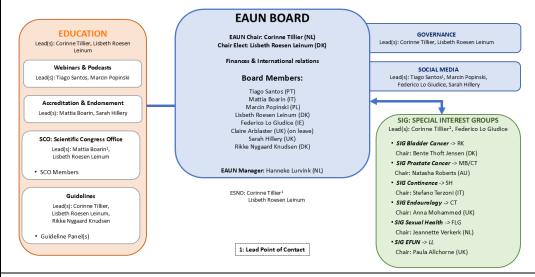

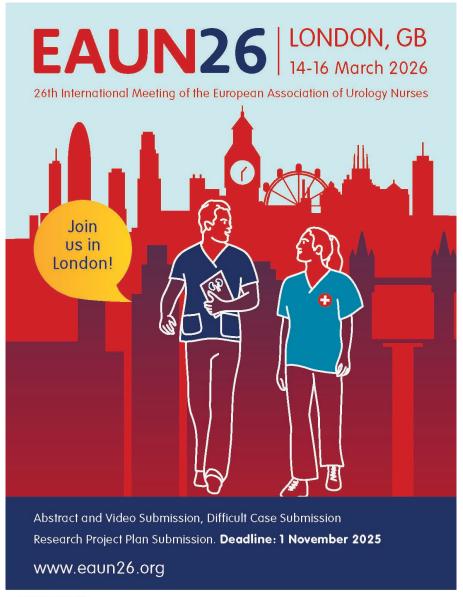
Closure
